- In their 2023 Accelerated Award Grant Guide, ALSF stated: “ALSF does not fund proposals for research utilizing human embryonic stem cells or nonhuman primates. Research with human induced pluripotent stem cells is permissible” (p.6, under “Restrictions” sub-heading).

- In each of their guidelines since 2020, Alex’s Lemonade Stand has made the statement that their funding and grant recipient’s funds may **not** be utilized on fetal cells or human embryonic stem cells.
