Through their "Health for Life" program, Friendship Bridge promotes birth control for women in Guatemala.

Friendship Bridge says that two common misconceptions about health in Guatemala are: "1) Birth control can cause cancer and/or permanent sterility; 2) Birth control pills can accumulate in your body leading to complications."

Friendship Bridge also presents what their "General Health Service Package" includes:

- ♦ Papanicolaou exam
- ♦ Cervical exam
- ♦ Breast exam
- Diabetes screening
- ♦ Hypertension screening
- ♦ Pregnancy test
- ♦ STI screening and treatment for pregnant women
- ♦ Family planning consult with a choice of methods: injections, implants, pills

highest unmet need for contraception in Guatemala...Clients who have been part of Friendship Bridge for three or more years do not pay for contraceptives, but a small number of clients pay a nominal fee equivalent to US\$19 for one year of the contraceptive of their choice" (p.2).
