
Feed the Children says the following about Guatemala, which is one of the regions they work in:

Over 60% of Guatemala's population lives in poverty contributing to unacceptably poor social indicators in the areas of health and development, including infant, child, and maternal mortality, malnutrition, literacy, **and contraceptive awareness and use.** Nearly one-half of Guatemala's children under age five are chronically malnourished, one of the highest malnutrition rates in the world. The country's large indigenous population is disproportionately affected by poverty and disease. Almost half of Guatemala's population is under age 19, making it the youngest population in Latin America.
