 American Life League received the following response from a representative of Children's Miracle Network Hospitals on 5/6/25:

Children's Miracle Network Hospitals is a fundraising organization that raises money for our 170 member hospitals throughout the United States and Canada. Children's Miracle Network disburses funds that are raised through our programs directly to the hospitals as unrestricted funds. The hospitals then use the donations to fund critical treatments and healthcare services, pediatric medical equipment, and charitable care. Each hospital uses these funds differently, putting them towards their areas of greatest need.  In 2024, a mother <u>writes about her IVF experiences</u>, crediting the support of the credit union funded by CMNH for her successful IVF experience:

We began our first intrauterine insemination (IUI) experience. The doctor described it as the first step before what I had more commonly understood to be the intervention, in vitro fertilization (IVF).

This year the CMN Hospitals LGBTQIA2S+ Employee Resource group (internally called a Flight Crew) awarded the 2024 Rainbow Award to the Extra Life Chicago Guild! They received this award because of their commitment to fierce advocacy and cultivating safe spaces both virtually and in-person for local LGBTQ+ gamers and allies!

Pride Month is here and as some in-person celebrations resume, political leaders across the country have introduced a record number of legislative bills targeting the very LGBTQ+ rights Pride Month honors. future of healthcare for LGBTQ+ kids.

Among those called into question is the right of transgender and nonbinary youth to access gender-affirming care —a form of healthcare that supports and affirms an individual's gender identity and expression.

Legislation to ban gender-affirming care up to age 18 passed in Idaho and Montana in April. Around the same time, Washington state passed a shield law to protect people seeking, providing or helping others obtain reproductive or gender-affirming care in Washington. These bills affect our patients and families as well as our care teams at Seattle Children's Gender Clinic.



Gender-affirming care can include using a patient's chosen name and pronouns as well as a range of medical interventions. The Gender Clinic, which opened in 2016, provides gender-affirming medical care for adolescents, including puberty blockers, gender-affirming hormones and mental health support.
